

## **JUNIOR HANDICRAFT SHOW**

The general rules for all Junior Non-Livestock Shows apply to the Handicraft Show as well as the following special rules:

1. Individuals can exhibit a maximum of (4) four entries in this show.
2. Any exhibits that can get dirty easily are required to be completely covered in clear plastic that can be opened.
3. An MCFA log sheet is required for all handicraft entries. <https://mcfa.org/events/junior-handicraft/>
4. Online Entries must be completed and paid (\$10 entry fee per item) by **Friday, February 4, 2022, by 5:00PM.** (See page forty-four (44) of Rule Book for Online Entry details)
5. Entries cannot be any larger than 8'h x 6'w x 6'd. **Items greater than 100lbs must have a mobility device, such as a furniture dolly, or casters, provided by the exhibitor that remains with the entry.**
6. The entry should be entered in the department that reflects the largest percentage of material and workmanship described in the exhibitor's log sheet.
7. No staging or enhancements of any kind should be added to the original entry. Only the item being judged should be presented.
8. **NO PROJECT BOOKS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITH ENTRY.**

## **JUNIOR HANDICRAFT SHOW AWARDS**

The preliminary judges may pick up to 10 (ten) top winners in the following:

- HANDICRAFT I – UP TO 10 TOP WINNERS
- HANDICRAFT II – UP TO 10 TOP WINNERS

These exhibitors will receive a finalist's ribbon **and must be present at the final judging.** In addition, up to 10 (ten) Honorable Mentions will be selected in each department and will receive Honorable Mention ribbons.

## **JUNIOR HANDICRAFT SHOW DEPARTMENTS**

### **DEPARTMENT: HANDICRAFT I**

Woodcraft, Metalcraft

- Woodcraft can be made by hand or machine, and include works burned, painted or miscellaneously constructed
- Metalcraft may be hand tooled, sculptured, enamel painted or miscellaneously constructed

### **DEPARTMENT: HANDICRAFT II**

Ceramics & Plaster, Artificial Flowers, Jewelry, Glass craft, Leather-craft tooling & dying, Scrap-booking

- Ceramics & Plastics can be handmade originals or cast from Commercial Molds
- Glass Craft may be painted or cut
- Scrap-booking – may be digital or traditional
- Mixed Materials – ex: dream-catchers or other items using a combination of materials.
